### **Turning Pink With Joy on Gaudete Sunday**

On the third Sunday of advent we celebrate Gaudete Sunday which is a joyous celebration. We get the name from the Introit for Gaudete Sunday which is taken from Philippians 4:4,5: "Gaudete in Domino semper" ("Rejoice in the Lord always"). In the past Advent was a penitential season like Lent and Gaudete Sunday served as a mid-point break from the austere practices to rejoice in the nearness of Jesus's birthday. To reflect the change of mood the Church lightens the mood a little, and the priest may wear rose vestments. The change in colour provides us with encouragement to continue our spiritual preparation, especially prayer, for Christmas. For this same reason of lightening the mood, the third candle of the Advent wreath, first lit on Gaudete Sunday, is traditionally rose-colored.

### **This is Baminelli Sunday**

Today, we are going to follow a tradition where, on the Third Sunday of Advent, the Baby Jesus from every crib and nativity scene in homes throughout the parish is brought to church to be blessed. In doing so we will be joining with our Holy Father, Pope Francis, as he will again be blessing the Baby Jesus from thousands of cribs in Rome and beyond.

Small bottles of Holy Water will be available on a "one per family" basis for people who wish to bless their crib at home.

Father Graham will bless any "forgotten" Baminelli next Sunday and at the Christmas Masses. Just bring your Baby Jesus figure with you and ask Fr Graham to bless it as you leave the church. You can also bless your Baminelli at home when you bless your crib scene (see the prayer later in this newsletter).

## **A Prayer of Blessing for Your Crib Scene**

God of every nation and people, from the very beginning of creation you have made manifest your love: when our need for a Saviour was great you sent your Son to be born of the Virgin Mary.

To our lives he brings joy and peace, justice, mercy, and love.

Lord, bless all who look upon this manger; may it remind us of the humble birth of Jesus, and raise up our thoughts to him, who is God-with-us and Saviour of all, and who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen

## **Holy Water**

Holy Water (water which has been blessed by a Priest) reminds us of our Baptism and is a sign of our prayers for ourselves, our homes, and religious objects to be dedicated in a special way to serving God and other people. Place a drop of Holy Water on your finger when you make the Sign of the Cross before your daily prayers, or sprinkle a few drops over the religious objects you use (Bibles, statues, pictures, rosaries, prayer books, the Christmas crib, etc.) to remind yourself to use them with faith and devotion. You can refill your Holy Water bottle, free of charge, from the container at the back of the church (in front of the glass screen at Sacred Heart; by the Sacred Heart chapel at St John Fisher).

### **Message from the Catholic Education Service**

Last year the Government promised to lift the 50% cap on faith admissions for new religious schools. This policy had proved to be an effective ban on any new Catholic schools as our Bishops ruled that opening a Catholic school that turned away Catholics for being Catholic was against Canon Law. The 50% cap was a policy that specifically targeted Catholics as Catholic schools are popular with parents of all faiths and none. Last September the Government acknowledged the cap was unfair to the Catholic community and pledged to scrap it. The Conservatives even included a commitment to remove it in their manifesto.

Unfortunately, the feedback we are getting is that the Secretary of State for Education is thinking about U-turning on this and breaking the Government's promise to Catholics. The Catholic community now needs to make its collective voice heard and tell the Secretary of State that this level of discrimination against Catholic schools, parents and children will not be tolerated. As such we are urging Catholics to write to the Secretary of State and their MP expressing their concern that this promise to our community could be broken. ### **Gift Aid**

Gift Aid is linked to basic rate tax (payable on income over £ £11,500.00 in 2017-18). If your circumstances have changed and you are no longer a tax payer please notify Sue in the Parish Office as soon as possible. Additionally, if you pay less Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax in any tax year that the amount of Gift Aid claimed on your donations, it is your responsibility to pay any difference.

If you go to hospital, make sure you tell the staff that you are Catholic and that you would like a priest to visit, otherwise the Chaplain has no way of knowing that you wish a visit. If you know of a relative or friend who is in hospital, make sure your parish priest knows, and he can arrange for the Chaplain to visit.
